This new campaign will educate Chicago youth and residents about innovative solutions at the intersection of hip hop music, architecture, urban planning, sociology, human development, African American Studies and medicine.

The event will unveil a new pilot study focused on wearable sensors that documented the impact of violent crime on residents from Chicago's Englewood community and its relationship to public health.
